The Point!

Looking at the above passage in **Psalm 95: 7-8**, the psalmist says. **"Today, if you will hear His voice: Do not harden your hearts."**, Many times I am afraid just like the calluses on our hand our heart can become as some would say, hardened!

Throughout most if not all of the apostle Paul's efforts in preaching the gospel, we read of his battles in addressing issues among Christians, such as paganism, sexual immorality, drunkenness, and the list goes on. He gave warning in the Roman letter saying, "Therefore God also gave them up to uncleanness, in the lusts of their hearts, to dishonor their bodies among themselves, who exchanged the truth of God for the lie, and worshiped and served the creature rather than the Creator, who is blessed forever", (Romans 1:24-25).

Take heed my friends when we continue to sin willfully, eventually just like the calluses on our hands our hearts won't hurt anymore. Meaning our consciences become callused and what used to really bother us doesn't bother us any longer.

For example, when we miss services to do what we want to do, we know that in "Hebrews 10:24-25" we are instructed, "not to forsake the assembling of ourselves together", so what do we do? We do it anyway. At first it may be missing Bible study, then it becomes evening services and before we know it we have quit all together!

We are warned, "Be sober, be vigilant; because your adversary the devil, as a roaring lion, walketh about, seeking whom he may devour:", 1 Peter 5:8. The one he is seeking to devour is you and me! So let's make sure that just as the Psalmist says, "Do not harden your hearts." Think!

"These are grumblers, complainers, walking according to their own lusts; and they mouth great swelling words, flattering people to gain advantage." (Jude 1:16)

Psalm 95:6-11

6 Oh come, let us worship and bow down; Let us kneel before the Lord our Maker. 7 For He is our God, and we are the people of His pasture, And the sheep of His hand. Today, if you will hear His voice: 8 "Do not harden your hearts, as in the rebellion, as in the day of trial in the wilderness, 9 When your fathers tested Me; They tried Me, though they saw My work. 10 For forty years I was grieved with that generation, And said, 'It is a people who go astray in their hearts, And they do not know My ways.' 11 So I swore in My wrath, 'They shall not enter My rest.'
