Awkward Faith

Is expressing your faith awkward to you? Are you uncomfortable when talking to others about God or spiritual things? Does it feel out of place for you to bow your head in prayer in settings other than the church's assemblies? Would it be strange for you to study the Bible with others outside the assemblies or even with members of your own family?

There may be many Christians who have such feelings about expressing their faith. They have resolved to make Jesus the center of their lives, yet they are not comfortable living out that resolution.

Why is this so? There are several possible reasons. One reason is ignorance. They just don't know what to do or say. Another reason is a lack of confidence. They are afraid of what others will think, and they don't want to feel foolish or make other people feel uncomfortable. A third reason is that they are not in the habit. They just are not accustomed to speaking about the Lord or praying around other people.

Underlying all of these reasons is a basic weakness of faith. Awkward faith is weak faith. This is not stated to be critical or offensive but to help find a solution. "Faith is the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen" (Heb. 11:1). Being assured and convicted about God does not make us awkward, but instead it makes us bold, confident, and courageous.

So then, overcoming awkwardness in faith is a matter of gaining strength. If there is a lack of assurance or conviction, then study the word of God more deeply and become convinced, for "faith comes from hearing, and hearing by the word of Christ" (Rom. 10:17). Live out that conviction and "be transformed by the renewing of your mind, so that you may prove what the will of God is, that which is good and acceptable and perfect" (Rom. 12:2). "Grow in the grace and knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ" (2Pet. 3:18) and be a true doer of the word (Jas. 1:22). Take action to overcome your awkwardness by changing your ways. Breach your self-imposed boundaries in order to expand your comfort zone. Make new habits. Learn how to pray around others. Become accustomed to speaking about the Lord to others, regardless of who they are. Take the first step and make a start.

You can begin with your own family. If you are married, then talk to your spouse about spiritual things if you are not doing so already. Simply read the Bible aloud to one another within your family. Get in the habit of praying together. Just make a start of it, and soon the awkwardness will fade away.

No Christian should feel awkward about faith in Jesus. He is our joy, comfort, and confidence. What should make us feel increasingly awkward is the world, for it is not our home, and we are aliens and strangers here (1Pet. 2:11). If you feel awkward about the world, then you are on the right track, but don't feel awkward about your faith.
